1. What hopes and expectations are there for this relationship? What do you want to happen in this time together?
2. What are timely and realistic goals?
3. What tools are to be used—such as books, experiences, communications, activations, role models, mentor's quiver (see Isaiah 49:1+, ones being disciplined at the same time), or heros?
4. Do you feel you have what you need in time, energy, maturity and gifting to make this relationship a success?
5. Is this a workable mentoring arrangement for you?
6. What challenges do you see in this relationship?
7. Again, what hopes do you have for this relationship?
8. How long is this mentoring relationship for? 1 Year
9. How will release from this mentoring relationship officially take place (by a prayer, certificate, party, released to responsibilities, etc.)?
